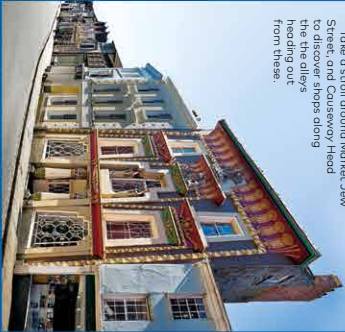

Penzance

For the top of Chapel Street, the town's most historic thoroughfare is the Egyptian House, built in 1839 during a national craze for Egyptology, while further down is the Turk's Head. Take a stroll around Market Jew Street, and Couswary Head to discover shops along the alleyways leading out from these.



Portsmouth

Stow away in the past, below, the beach at Portsmouth is just as busy. It has soft sand and a steeply shaling beach, but the stream at the top of the beach is ideal for children to paddle in. There are cafes and toilets nearby and spectacular walks leading away from it.

Telegraph Museum

It was the hub of international cable communications from 1870 to 1970 and a training college for the communication industry until 1933. During the Second World War, secret tunnels were dug by Cornish miners to house an underground building and gas-proof tunnels provided 14 secure cabs out of the UK to its allies. It's a fascinating place to explore.



Enjoy cakes freshly baked by the museum's chef, and beautifully prepared seasonal salads using organic leaves from chef's own garden. The cafe is open from nearby Newlyn's snicker meads from St Ives, and the Cornish dotted cream comes from the Family-run Trewhen Dairy - pigstorium.com 01736 810 965

Newlyn

It is never far away in this part of Cornwall and these galleries showcase the very best of national and international contemporary art, as well as work by some of the best artists currently working in the region. newlynartgallery.co.uk 01736 363 715

Minack Theatre

Cornwall's world famous open-air theatre, created by Edward Coxhead, is set in a dramatic cliff and set in glorious gardens overlooking the spectacular panorama of Portcromo Bay. There's a season in May to September but it's a great place to visit during the day with exotic sub-tropical gardens adding colour. Discover how Rowena built this place, then relax in the cafe that overlooks the theatre and soak up the magic that is Minack.

Take St Ives

With stunning views over the Atlantic Ocean, this gallery has a collection of art by local artists, including Ian MacKenzie, the Barber, Hepworth and Ben Nicholson, alongside an ever-changing programme of thought-provoking exhibitions. take.org.uk 01736 791 177

St Ives

Surrounded by gorgeous beaches, this arty town sits around the harbor with fishing boats bobbing in the sea. There are trips round the bay to take or wander around the historic web of cobbled streets to discover charming independent shops, interesting galleries, and great cafes and restaurants, whatever you want a quick cappuccino or the real.

Artists have flocked to St Ives for many years and it still has a buzzing creative scene. Take a look at the famous exhibition as well as past by the artist. And don't forget the sandy beaches with a sprinkling second of sea for a day or two building sandcastles!

Geopon Tin Mine

Mineral mining in Cornwall began 4,000 years ago and by the 19th century Cornwall became the world's leading supplier of copper. By 1860, tin was Cornwall's most important metal export and this continued through much of the 20th century.

Hear the story of tin mining and go underground to go back in time and learn about the people that worked these mines. 01736 788 652

Everywhere you look the scenery is breathtaking, with ever-changing views of the Atlantic ocean, like this one below of Cape Cornwall.



Sennen Cove

With a few shops, nice cafes and a great pub in a beautiful setting, Sennen Cove is a delight. Whitesands Beach is ideal for swimming.

The Roundhouse and Capson Gallery is a showcase for Cornish art and craft, with work by popular Cornish artists. It was built to house the capson wheel which used to wind boats up and down the slip, originally part of the winding gear of a local tin mine before the advent of steam. roundhouse.co.uk 01736 871 859

Land's End

Getting out into the Atlantic Ocean, this is the most westerly point of England. Enjoy a coffee, lunch or delicious Cornish Fish or visit the Cornish Cove on boat, and a resident artist in the Penwith House gallery. Get out to the Looe Lighthouse. Further out are the Isles of Scilly, then nothing until America. You could take the 1-mile walk to Sennen Cove with wild flowers all around and overviews.



St Michael's Mount

The rocky island crowned by a medieval church and castle is a spectacular sight out in Mount's Bay off Land's End and you can walk across at low tide. Get right into the sea on the boats to ferry you.

It's still home to the St Aubyn family and a small community in the village. Enjoy the outstanding views over the bay and discover its rich history and strange tales. stmichaelsmount.co.uk 01736 887 892
